

The series "Art of the North at the National Museum in Warsaw" lasts until September 13 - check on-line

Looking at the collection of the National Museum in Warsaw we will look for Nordic inspirations in Polish painting, as well as objects from the far North.

Rocky fjords, cold northern beaches, wild waterfalls - Scandinavian landscapes attracted artists as much as the sun-drenched south. However, Norwegian and Icelandic art are little known in Poland.

And yet there are connections between the art of these countries and Poland, one can recreate a network of contacts between Polish and Nordic artists and even find mutual inspiration in their works. In addition, in the collections of Polish museums we can find objects representing the art of the Nordic circle.
